Background	The International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Programme of Action, adopted in 1994 by 179 Member States including Malaysia, lays out a far-sighted plan for advancing human well-being that places the human rights of individuals, rather than numerical population targets, at the centre of the global development agenda. It emphasizes the value of investing in women and girls, both as an end in itself, and as a key to improving the quality of life for everyone. And it affirms the importance of sexual and reproductive health, including family planning, as a precondition for women's empowerment. It calls for an end to gender-based violence (GBV) and harmful practices.	
	Guided by the ICPD, UNFPA partners with government, civil society, academia, sister agencies in the United Nations Country Team and other agencies to advance its mission; geared in particular towards collaborating on engagement in policy dialogue and advocacy. UNFPA Malaysia as part of the UN Country Team leads the advancement of sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR), and is chairing the UN Gender Results Group (GRG) to enhance the UN support for the advancement of Gender Equality and CEDAW commitments into national planning processes aligned to the SDG Agenda for 2030 and UNFPA's reaffirmed commitment on the ICPD agenda.	
	Further to this agenda, UNFPA continuously work to address those furthest behind, addressing existing gaps in Malaysia, investing in state-level interventions. With this outlook, UNFPA plans to strengthen its programme and partnership in Sarawak recognizing that Sarawak is the third poorest state in Malaysia with geographical challenges to access services. Recent statistics show that Sarawak has increasing rate of teenage pregnancy, and it is one of the states with the highest child marriage cases in Malaysia. Sarawak is also projected to become an ageing state in 2028, when 16 per cent of its population consists of those aged 60 and above; another core mandate area of concern for UNFPA.	
	While the situation prevails as such in Sarawak, there are huge opportunities to address these concerns with progressive state authorities' support. There have been efforts to reduce the number of teenage pregnancies with the formation of the One Stop Teenage Pregnancy Committee (OSTPC), Sexual Awareness and Advocacy Programme (KAPS), and studies available addressing the situation. There have been efforts to support women's economic empowerment and their participation in SMEs. On the issue of ageing, Sarawak has set up a consortium to carry out a study on its senior citizens and rapidly growing ageing population.	
	Guided by this progress and other situational analyses of Sarawak, UNFPA plans to develop and design its programme in Sarawak in consultation with relevant stakeholders in Sarawak. UNFPA is therefore seeking a suitable consultant to support the development and designing of its programme in Sarawak.	
Purpose of consultancy:	To support development and designing of UNFPA Malaysia's programme in Sarawak in strengthening and advocating work related to SRHR, Comprehensive	

	Sexuality Education (CSE), gender equality, prevention of GBV and addressing population dynamics, notably ageing. The consultant will support UNFPA in strengthening its partnership including high-level engagements, in advancing UNFPA mandate in Sarawak.

	1. Review relevant materials including UNFPA Country Programme Action Plan 2022-2025.
	2. Mapping of existing SRHR, CSE, gender equality, GBV, ageing programmer in Sarawak.
	3. Engage and map relevant stakeholders in Sarawak that have potential to collaborate with UNFPA.
	4. Support strengthening of UNFPA strategic relationship and partnership with key stakeholders in Sarawak including the Economic Planning Unit of Sarawak and Sarawak Women, Child Development and Community Welfare Ministry.
	5. Organise a stakeholder consultation in Sarawak to consult relevant stakeholders in developing proposed programmes and/or policies.
	6. Draft proposed programmes and partnership for UNFPA in Sarawak in a consultative manner. The proposed programmes should include:
	a. Proposed programmes and/or policies for Sarawak government and potential stakeholders including CSOs, private sector to implement guided by Malaysia's commitment to ICPD, SDGs, CEDAW and linkages to policies set at federal level.
	b. Proposed programmes for UNFPA support guided by Malaysia's commitment to ICPD, SDGs, CEDAW and linkages to policies set at federal level.
	c. Governance mechanism, action plan and monitoring framework for the Sarawak state government to address UNFPA mandated areas.
	d. Proposed short term and long term planning.
	e. Proposed solutions to address challenges and gaps of existing programmes and/or policies by relevant stakeholders e.g. LPPKN, Sarawak Family Planning Association, Malaysian Red Crescent Sarawak, etc.
	7. Utilise UNFPA technical resources to support initiatives.
	8. Public advocacy and/or representing UNFPA in technical committees/meetings providing technical support where required.
	Any other relevant tasks as requested by the Representative and Assistan Representative directly relevant to advancing SRHR, CSE and Population Dynamic and Ageing in Sarawak.
